- The NGC and NHF-GC Scholarships are for US citizens/students already in college.
- NGC awards many scholarships up to \$4,000.
- The NHFGC scholarship is \$4500.
- Students must have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 (on a 4.0 scale).
